



Report on the Damages Caused by Rains and Floods in IDP Camps in Al Qahirah and Salah Districts, Taiz Governorate

Date: 17- 18 August 2024

Introduction

Between August 17-18, 2024, heavy rains and flooding severely destroyed the shelters, non-food items (NFIs), and food supplies of internally displaced persons in Al Qahirah and Salah Districts, Taiz Governorate. A total of **242 IDPs** living in **nine** sites in Al Qahirah District and **one** site in Salah District were affected by the rains and floods. The displaced households are currently in urgent need of food, shelter, non-food items (NFIs), and medical aid.

Damage

- Conducting field visits to the sites affected and monitoring and assessing the needs
- Raise urgent appeals to humanitarian actors and clusters and all partners to provide assistance
- Communicate with the local authority in the governorate concerning the current situation in the sites



Interventions

No interventions have been made as of the time of writing this report.

Recommendations

- Providing emergency stocks (food-non-food) for the most affected cases
- Finding sustainable shelter solutions for IDPs living in camps.
- Rapid intervention of humanitarian partners to save the affected households.
- Call on the international community to help the government to confront the effects of climate change,
- Build the capacity of the Ex.U. and create permanent and effective mechanisms to confront such situations.
- Joint cooperation between local authorities and non-governmental organizations to find solutions for safe sites and away from the flood stream of IDP camps.
